Health Information Technicians use information protection standards while using, analyzing, storing, retreiving, and presenting data for the use of reimbursement, research, support of departmental operations, and clinical and business decsions in healthcare settings.



Program Outcomes

Health Information Technology students will earn an Associate of Applied Science (AAS) degree in preparation to sit for the nationally-recognized Registered Health Information Technician (RHIT) exam. Students will learn the knowledge and skills necessary to analyze, present, abstract, code, store, and retrieve data for the support of business, clinical, and departmental decisions in healthcare or related organizations.
