Luckily, only a change in ventilation is needed using a "sock" system instead of the standard metal vents to avoid condensation dripping on the new gym floor.

If you've been to the Union in the location of the former Kansas Works office there is a beautiful stone fireplace that is currently boarded over. These additions will be much like those currently found at the softball field. Head Coach Steve Murry will be working with VP Ben Smith and the Operations staff to design the facility this academic year. We hope to break ground on this project as soon as baseball season is over in May 2015 (hopefully that is very late, like after the College World Series). The funds for this project will come from the out district fee, which is charged to students who live outside Neosho County. These fee accounts will also pay for the gym air conditioning and the minor Student Union renovation.

I am VERY excited about these upcoming projects! I know you are going to love the finished project.

After LONG deliberation, making lists, creating a scoring system, narrowing down the list, and sleeping on it, Jen picked a table. I had no idea a dining room table and chairs were such a big commitment to her.
